ORDER GRANTING OMBUDSMAN’S MOTION IN AID OF APPOINTMENT

The Court has considered the Motion filed by the Patient Care Ombudsman styled, “Motion in Aid of Appointment as Patient Care Ombudsman” and finds that it is well-founded and should be granted. It is therefore,

ORDERED that the Debtor shall cooperate with the Patient Care Ombudsman in all respects, including making its Medical Director and/or other physicians under the its control available for interviews as requested; it is further

ORDERED that the Patient Care Ombudsman shall serve a copy of her Notice of Forthcoming Reports on the Facility Administrator in lieu of serving “all patients” as required by Bankruptcy Rule 2015.1(a). The Facility Administrator shall distribute copies of the notice to the patients and/or their representatives at his or her discretion in order to lessen the potential for confusion and alarm; it is further

ORDERED that Notice of the Forthcoming Reports shall be posted at the facility for the duration of this bankruptcy case at the locations directed by the Court; it is further

ORDERED that a copy of the written report shall be posted at the facility in the same location(s) as the Notice of Forthcoming Reports and that each Report shall remain posted until the next Report is filed, at which time it may be removed and replaced with the most recent Report.
