> John Diaz requested that I provide you some information related to
our recommendations concerning the Office of the Long Term Care
Ombudsman Program.
> The Arkansas State Long-Term Care Ombudsman as we understand it is
supervised by the administrator of the Adult Protective Services
Program. The Coordinator of the volunteer component of the Ombudsman
Program is not under the direct supervision and oversight of the State
Ombudsman.
The Older Americans Act requires that States establish an Office of the
Long-Term Care Ombudsman, headed by the Start Long-Term Care Ombudsman.
It is recommended that the volunteer component of the Long-Term Care
Ombudsman Program be located within the Office of the Long-Term Care
Ombudsman and, thereby, under the direction of the State Long Term Care
Ombudsman. This does not mean that the day to day activities of the
volunteer ombudsmen would be supervised by the State Ombudsman, rather,
that the volunteer component would be under the program direction of
the State Ombudsman and be located within the Office of the State Long-
Term Care Ombudsman.
> The requirement for an Office of the Long-Term Care Ombudsman implies
that the State Ombudsman should have a significant placement within the
agency and have control over all aspects of the program. The placement
of the Office of the LTC Ombudsman Program under the supervision of the
Administrator of the APS Program may result in conflicts with Ombudsman
responsibilities. These potential conflicts are detailed in the
attached 1994 Symposium Report that examines the relationship between
APS Programs and LTC Ombudsman Programs. The outcome of the Symposium
Report is that the two programs have significant differences and should
remain administratively separate.
> Finally, it was recommended that the Office of the LTC Ombudsman be
under the supervision of the Division Director or Deputy Division
Director. This recommendation is based on the need for upper
management's support of the Office of the Ombudsman to effectively
carry out its functions set forth in Section 712(a)(3).
