What Are Resident's Rights?

- Be treated with dignity and respect
- To choose schedules and activities
- To be fully informed of all personal information
- To share a complaint with anyone without fear of retaliation
- Right to decide who visits you and who you do not wish to see
- To have information regarding your own financial affairs
- You have a right to private conversation with anyone you decide
- A Right to appeal a discharge or transfer and not be discharged while the appeal is pending
