Mental Health Community Residence Facility (MHCRF) residents are protected by the laws of the United States of America and the District of Columbia.


## UNDER THESE LAWS, RESIDENTS HAVE THE RIGHT TO:

- Have visitors at any reasonable hour
- Handle personal money and business affairs
- Make personal medical decisions and freedom to refuse treatment
- Wear your own clothing
- Have mail delivered unopened

- Have access to a telephone or to have a private telephone installed at your own expense
- Bring personal possessions and furnishings into living quarters
- Privacy in your own room
- Religious freedom
- Register complaints and have them resolved without retaliation

- Participate in any plan of care meeting and to have information about services, charges and house rules
- Be given advance written and oral notice before any transfer, discharge or relocation and be given a chance to appeal the move
