National Paralysis Resource Center

In 2002, the National Paralysis Resource Center opened its doors to promote the health, independence and well-being of individuals living with paralysis by providing comprehensive resources, education and referral services.

Information Specialists

Provide individualized support and guidance to people living with paralysis, as well as their family and caregivers.

Peer & Family Support Program

Offers peer-to-peer support to help families impacted by paralysis navigate the short-term realities and long-term challenges.

Quality Of Life Grants Program

Awards financial support to nonprofit organizations that mirror the Reeve Foundation's mission to improve quality of life.

Military & Veterans Program

Supports the unique needs of service members regardless of when they served or what caused/causes their paralysis.



Resources for Caregivers



- Section of website devoted to caregivers, including tips and links to other helpful information.
- Blogs and other content by and for caregivers.
- Virtual support groups held twice a month for caregivers and family members, led by a mental health professional and a peer with lived experience.
- Peer mentoring program that extends to caregivers — those who apply will be matched with another caregiver for conversations and support.

Peer & Family Support Programs

Virtual Support Groups

- Living with Paralysis support groups and Caring for a Family Member with Paralysis support group
- Each FREE group is led by a mental health professional and a peer with lived experience
- Separate Living with Paralysis support groups are held for people living with paraplegia and those with quadriplegia
- A chance to connect with others and gain insight, support, and guidance
- Each group meets twice a month





Quality of Life Grants Program

- Provides grants to nonprofit organizations whose projects and initiatives foster inclusion, involvement and community engagement, while promoting health and wellness for those affected by paralysis in all 50 states and U.S. territories.
- \$41 million to 3,700 organizations since 1999



Advocacy

- Online advocacy program with over 10,000 advocates across the country – our goal is 12,000 by the end of the year
- Regional Champion Program –
 72 grassroots advocates across 27 states, eventual goal of every state and congressional district being covered.
 Legislative "first responders"
- 2023 Federal Priorities: passage of the Air Carrier Access Amendments Act, funding caregiving solutions, funding SCI Model System centers, funding for paralysis research, funding for the NPRC



Military & Veterans Program

- Supports all military service members no matter when they served
 - Injury doesn't need to be combat or service related.
 - Covers all types of paralysis under the NPRC. Also covers caregivers.
- Offers tailored information and referral services
- Helps individuals navigate military benefits and civilian programs
- Military and veteran peer mentors are available through our Peer and Family Support Program
- Fosters higher levels of health, wellbeing, and independent living






- Rural Quality of Life grant




Fact Sheets and Education Booklets





Disabilities

Individuals with Disabilities

A disability is an impairment that may be cognitive, developmental, intellectual, mental, physical, sensory, or some combination of these. It substantially affects a person's life activities and may be present from birth or occur during a person's lifetime. Disability is an umbrella term, covering impairments, activity limitations, and participation restrictions. An impairment is a problem in body function or structure; an activity limitation is a difficulty encountered by an individual in executing a task or action; while a participation restriction is a problem experienced by an individual in involvement in life situations. Disability is thus not just a health problem. It is a complex phenomenon, reflecting the interaction between features of a person's body and features of the society in which he or she lives.
