

Dates and Deadlines:

- **October 9:** Deadline to register to vote or update your registration
- **October 24:** Voting begins for Absentee In Person, Early, Special Needs, and Absentee by Electronic Transmission
- **October 29:** Deadline to submit applications to vote by Absentee By Mail Ballot
- **November 5 & 6:** Regional offices open for Absentee In Person, Special Needs, and Early Voting
- **November 8: GENERAL ELECTION DAY.** Polls open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. Absentee ballots must be post-marked by November 8th.

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Registering to Vote

The **right to vote** is a cornerstone of our society. Residents of long-term care facilities retain their voting rights no matter where they live or what type of care they receive.

Make your voice matter



This fact sheet is intended to provide information for all long-term care residents on how to register to vote.

FIRST

Who Can Register:

You can register to vote if you:

- Are a United States citizen
- Are an Alaska resident
- Are at least 18 years old
- Have restored voting rights after a felony conviction

Who Can Vote:

You may vote for state candidates if you:

- Meet all of the criteria above
- Have been a resident of the state for at least 30 days before an election
- Have registered to vote on or before October 9th

You may vote for presidential candidates if you:

- Register and vote on or before November 8th, General Election Day

SECOND

What will you need:

If you were previously registered:

- A valid Alaska driver's license, state ID, or SSN#

For new registrations, one of the following types of ID:

- Current and valid Driver's License or State ID card
- Passport, Birth Certificate, or BIA card, or
- Government benefits letter with your name and address on it

THIRD

How To Register:

First check online to see if you are currently registered by going to:

- If you cannot check online call the Division of Elections at (866) 958-8683
- If your name, address, or party affiliation has changed, you must register again

To register online go to:

<https://voterregistration.alaska.gov/>

- Have your valid Alaska driver's license or state ID
- Information entered must match DMV records

To register by mail or in person:

- Complete and sign a Voter Registration Application, which can be found online here: <https://elections.alaska.gov/doc/forms/C03.pdf>
- Return your completed form to a Regional Elections office by mail, fax, email, or in person. Find your local office's contact information here: https://elections.alaska.gov/csm_contact_reo.php
